

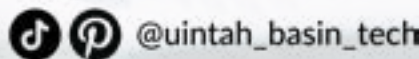
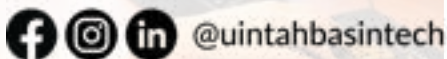

Descriptions

The Auto Department offers three separate certificates:

- Tire and Lube Technician** program is an entry level program designed for automotive-minded students, enabling them to learn the skills essential to enter the field of automotive preventative services.
- Automotive Maintenance & Light Repair** program students have entry-level skills in a variety of service areas. Graduates will be employable in a variety of entry-level positions.
- Auto Technology** program students have skills in inspecting, maintaining, and repairing mechanical, electrical, and hydraulic parts of automobiles, trucks, industrial equipment, and other fuel-powered vehicles.

The Business Department offers three separate certificates:

- Office and Financial Technician** program is designed to train students with little to no office skills to work in an entry level office setting.
- Administrative Assistant** program is designed to take students to a more advanced office environment career and will increase their knowledge of office software and data organization.
- Business Manager** program will help students reach management potential and allows students various experiences with either work-based learning, specialized training, or competing on a real world scale.

Cabinetry program is designed for secondary students to learn the fundamentals of cabinet construction.

Construction Technology program gives students hands-on experience in all phases of construction. Students can expect to learn concrete, framing, roofing, siding, and drywall skills.

The Culinary Department offers two separate certificates:

- Line Cook** certificate establishes effective skills training to organize, prepare, and present hot and cold foods.
- Culinary Arts** is for those who are interested in cooking, food preparation, and management and gives students real-life experience working the food service industry.

Electrical Apprentice Classroom Training is designed to provide the necessary concepts and theory required to become a state licensed Journeyman Electrician.

Electrical Technician program will prepare students to apply technical knowledge and skills to assemble, install, operate, maintain, and repair electrically energized systems, such as residential, commercial, and industrial electric-power systems wiring, D.C. and A.C. motors, controls, and electrical distribution panels.

Farm/Ranch Management course offers individualized continuing education for farmers and ranchers. Learn business management skills needed to analyze farm records and apply them to the individual operation. Participants in this course are assisted in keeping a complete set of financial records using Microsoft Excel and Quicken and/or Quickbooks.

The Diesel Department offers three separate certificates:

- Preventative Maintenance Technician** gives students an overview for working in the heavy duty diesel industry.
- Diesel Technician I** prepares students for work in the industry as a diesel equipment technician.
- Diesel Technician II** prepares students for work in the industry as a diesel mechanic.

Introduction to Lease Operating This program will prepare students for work in the oil & gas industry.

The IT Department offers three separate certificates:

- IT Support Technician** program students will receive training in both technical skills and necessary soft skills in basic IT support, troubleshooting hardware and software issues, basic networking, and security.
- Network Technician** program students will learn the skills necessary to secure a network by developing network access and maintaining documentation while providing reference and support.
- Security Technician** program students will learn to plan network installations, order and mount appropriate equipment, and understand industry standards and documentation.

Nursing Assistant program prepares graduates to assist Registered Nurses (RN) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) in giving total bedside care to the sick and elderly in long-term care facilities.

Medical Assistant program prepares students with knowledge of health sciences, communication, and specialized skills, assisting physicians, and other healthcare professionals in a patient care setting.

Pharmacy Technician program prepares students to work directly under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist to perform various duties. Students will learn to receive prescriptions and obtain necessary information, process prescriptions using patient profiles found on a computer database, select and package correct medication from inventory, prepare intravenous medications using sterile techniques, and maintain professional work ethics.

Practical Nursing program combines basic skills with scientific principles and nursing theory. Learning is organized according to body systems ranging from simple to complex, with each concept building upon another. Students practice both the theory and application of principles learned, first in a simulated lab situation and then in care facilities under the supervision of faculty members.

Surgical Technician students learn the first scrub role and to help with the preparation of the operation room by setting up sterile surgical equipment, checking equipment for proper functionality, and assisting the surgeon with instruments and supplies while maintaining the sterile field.

Tower Technician program will train students for entry level positions as tower technicians, you need to be comfortable working with heights and being outside in various weather conditions. Students will obtain certifications in climbing, safety, and fall protection.

The Transporation Department offers two separate certificates:

- CDL** program prepares students with the skills they need to join the professional truck driving industry.
- Advanced Energy Transportation** program trains on Long Commercial Vehicles, Hazardous Materials ELDT, and Liquid Haul.

Well Control Supervisor program prepares students with in-depth knowledge of well control and blowback control to safely supervise a drilling crew and ensure safety of the employees on site as well as the drilling equipment.

Well Control Workover Operator program uses state-of-the-art simulation to prepare students with skills to safely operate workover processes of well control.

The Welding Department offers three separate certificates:

- Welding Basic Technician** program is designed for students enabling them to learn a basic welding skills foundation to enter the welding industry.
- Welding Intermediate Technican** Students will learn basic skills in welding equipment operation, safety instruction, welding processes, and fabrication. The skills taught at this level give each student the ability to continue in an advanced program, ensuring the skills needed for employment.
- Welding Advanced Technician** Students learn technical information and skills training in welding all positions on plate and pipe material. Graduates will develop skills in industrial welding, oxy-fuel cutting, shielded metal arc welding, gas metal arc welding, plasma cutting, gas tungsten arc welding, and pipe welding.

SAFETY COURSES

PEC H2S CLEAR

This course not only improves safety performance, it also prepares general industry workers by providing crucial knowledge of the dangers of H2S and all the precautions, tools, and controls necessary when working in H2S environments. This course has no prerequisite and covers the current classroom requirements of ANSI Z390.1 and is designed to meet the new ANSI requirements.



ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION: Accident investigation procedures and analysis techniques.

AERIAL LIFT OPERATOR CERTIFICATION: 3 yr Certification, includes theory and practical training per OSHA requirements.

CONFINED SPACE: Provides training on identification of permit and non-permit required confined spaces, the hazards associated with them and implementing of confined space programs.

CONTRACTOR CONTINUING ED 6 HOURS (OR 3 HOURS): Coming this fall August through November. General overview on code updates w/emphasis on local non-compliance issues designed to provide the continuing education required for contractors. Contact Kimberli Wadsworth for more information | 435.725.7110

DEFENSIVE DRIVING PASSENGER CAR: This course offers practical strategies to reduce collision-related injuries, fatalities and cost by reinforcing good driving skills, putting defensive driving in a personal context and showing students the consequences of the choices they make behind the wheel.

EMERGENCY/FIRE & EVACUATION PLANNING:

Provides training on determining if a workplace requires an emergency action plan. Development of and implementation of an emergency action and fire protection plans.

FALL PROTECTION: Fall protection programs. Fall protection methods, including components of and limitations of fall protection systems.

HSI FIRST AID/CPR WITH AED: A combined adult first aid, AED, and CPR certification course designed for the occupational first aid provider. Child/infant endorsement available.

INCIPIENT FIRE TRAINING (FIRE EXTINGUISHER): OSHA compliant incipient fire extinguisher training, includes theory and practical.

FORKLIFT OPERATOR CERTIFICATION (COUNTER BALANCE OR ROUGH TERRAIN): 3 yr Certification, includes theory and practical training per OSHA requirements.



SAFETY COURSES

CONTINUED

HAZCOM GHS: Training on SDS sheets and Chemical Labeling mandate.

HAZWOPER 8, 24 OR 40 HR: Let UBTech provide the knowledge and skills necessary to ensure the safety of response personnel when taking action to contain and control releases of hazardous materials or response to disaster events that have impacted the workplace and community. This training will aid employers in compliance with local, state and federal regulations applicable to spill and disaster response cleanup. UBTech offers 8 hour refresher and 24 & 40 hour trainings.

HEARING PROTECTION: Training on recognizing noise hazards, noise exposure control and selection and use of hearing protection.

HEAT/COLD AND BIOLOGICAL HAZARDS: Training on heat & cold emergencies and biological hazards in the workplace.

HM126 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Teaches the signage and handling/transporting of hazardous materials. 49 CFR 172.704

LOCKOUT/TAGOUT CONTROL OF HAZARDOUS ENERGY: Covers the types and detection of hazardous energy, control measures, and developing and implementing energy control programs.

AIRBRAKE WORKSHOP: Covers the inspection and adjustment of airbrakes.

DEFENSIVE DRIVING FOR PROFESSIONAL TRUCK DRIVERS: Designed for the CDL driver. Drivers learn to recognize potential hazards and learn best practices to promote safe driving skills.

DOT HM126 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Teaches the signage and handling/transporting of hazardous materials. 49 CFR 172.704

OSHA 10 HR GENERAL INDUSTRY: Taught per OSHA requirements. Utilized by many industries in and out of the oil and gas industry.

PPE/ERGONOMICS/HAND & BACK SAFETY: Teaches personal protective equipment, ergonomics and hand & back safety requirements

PEC CORE COMPLIANCE: A standardized program covering the health, safety and environmental training most requested by oilfield operators and host employers. Instructor-led training that is Safeland accredited and provides training beyond the awareness level for over 30 topics.

PEC SAFELAND 2021: Designed specifically for the US onshore E & P Industry. Consistent EH & S orientation which is industry recognized and widely accepted.

RIGGING/SIGNALPERSON: Common rigging utilized in lifts and the theory & practical training for the signalperson.

TRENCHING & SHORING: Provides training on various soil types, soil mechanics, shoring and the use of protective systems.

VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTION: Tractor/Trailer/Bus, Light Duty Truck/Passenger Vehicle, or Motorcycle/ATV. Each course meets the Utah DOT requirements to become a safety inspector for the type of vehicle specified. Offered by request only.

WINTER DRIVING: Provides information and training for driving in adverse weather and how to prepare your vehicle for driving in winter conditions.

DOT LOG BOOK HOS: Designed for individuals and employers who need to know and discuss applicable DOT laws regarding hours of service regulations and proper log-book completion, including electronic logs.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ENDORSEMENT TRAINING: Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) required before testing to receive a Hazmat Endorsement.
